Good internship experience is a must if students want to land a dream job, says Elizabeth Venturini, President and Founder 6blegeCareerResults. She suggests students consider taking a business etiquette class to learn about how to work with clients and network, as well as the Myers Briggs Type Indicator and Strong Interest Inventory assessments to help them learn about their personality type and interests.

When students land a job interview, there are five important ways that they can stand out, says Holly Rodriguez, a communications professional in Richmond, Va.:



- 1. **Research, research.** If you land an interview, don't go in "cold." Make sure you have researched the company their website, their social media presence and, as an added bonus, their top two competitors.
- 2. **Find something in common**. Before the interview even begins, talk about a generic topic to find common ground between you and your interviewer.
- 3. **Ask good questions.** A job interview is not just a one-way street. You want to find out if this company is the right match for you as well. Having questions ready will show the person interviewing that you are not just a doer, but a thinker as well.
- 4. Know your resume backwards and forwards. Be able to elaborate on each point of your resume in a concise 30 seconds each.
- 5. **Know Thyself.** Be familiar with your strengths and weaknesses. This may sound old-school, but you want to acknowledge a positive weakness (ex. sometimes I am a little too dedicated) and outweigh it with your positive attributes (I'm punctual, I'm detail-oriented).

"A motivational mindset will help you set yourself apart from others and be the candidate that hiring managers want to see," says Mike Provitera, author of <u>Mastering Self-Motivation</u>. "Match your skills to the job market and you should be fine."

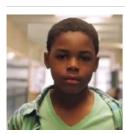
